



## CHAPERON RESPONSIBILITIES AND CODE OF ETHICS:

### WELCOME to the Dancer in Me Training Institute & The Long Beach Unity Festival!

In order to make this experience a successful, smooth, inspirational, and memorable time for you, we would like to share our Code of Ethics and a few general responsibilities for those serving as Chaperons.:

#### CHAPERON RESPONSIBILITIES:

Your participation at DIM/LBUF One-Day Training (Sat. March 7, 2020) AND/OR DIM INTERNATIONAL JAMAICA (March 25-30, 2020) requires ONE (1) Adult Chaperon per groups ranging in size of 1- 5 Youth (i.e. 17 & Under).

#### HOTEL:

- No youth are to be in any public area (elevator, pool, lobby, or breakfast area) without a chaperon.
- There is a zero-tolerance policy for children/youth with or without their chaperon who are unruly or disrespectful. We do not anticipate this, however, please communicate this clearly to your youth. This also applies to the chaperon themselves.

#### BUS/SHUTTLE: (If Applicable)

- No youth are allowed to board conference bus/van without a chaperon AND their conference wristband.

#### CABRILLO HS (Long Beach) or EDNA MANLEY COLLEGE OF THE VISUAL & PERFORMING ARTS (Jamaica):

- No youth are allowed to walk around the campus, go to restrooms, or to any classes without a chaperon.
- No youth are allowed to walk around the campus of Cabrillo HS (Long Beach) OR Edna Manley College (Jamaica) go to restrooms or sit in the concert/auditorium/worship services without a chaperon.
- Chaperons must attend all classes **with** their youth. Chaperons are not present to take classes themselves, rather observe, care for and attend to the needs/well-being of your group.

**Note:** Drugs, substance use, alcohol usage are prohibited.
